

National Representatives



In short, OCEANS' success in appointing representatives in 33 countries is a testament to our commitment to promoting international exchange and fostering a global community of learners and advocates.





OCEANS Network's mission is to support intercultural exchange and global dialogue between alumni and students; empower members in their personal and professional development; and enhance internationalisation of higher education by supporting universities around the world to take part in international credit mobility programmes. In this way, the organization, through its national representatives, seeks partnerships with universities to expand possibilities for its members. Recently, board members met with **Laura Ancona Lopez**, vice-dean of academic internationalization at Universidade Paulista (UNIP), Brazil.

The meeting was attended by the president of the OCEANS Network, **Farouk Kouider Moussaoui**, the vice-president, **Philippe Sessou**, as well as the members of the Organization's Administrative Council: **Mohammed Ashqar**, Head of International Coordination; Donaldson Chima Ofoha, Head of Communication; **Carlos Alberto Lino Filho**, Head of Content Development. The main objective of the meeting was to discuss the functions of the OCEANS Network, as well as the organization's past and future projects. Furthermore, **Laura** explained about Universidade Paulista, which has partnerships with European universities through the Erasmus+ program.

The OCEANS Network, in turn, seeks partnerships with universities through its national representatives. With Universidade Paulista, for example, the national representative of OCEANS in Brazil, **Luan Monteiro**, will meet with the university's internationalization council to propose partnerships to attract more members in addition to developing projects in partnership with the university, which is the largest in Brazil.

OCEANS Network members participate in workshops in countries around the world



PROJECTS NEWS

Project 1: Developing Excellence in Leadership

The EU Commission announced that 2023 is to be the European Year of Skills. This aims to address the challenges of improving employment rates and ensuring that the workforce has the necessary skills that employers need.

This project recognizes that almost all workplace roles require the skills of effective leadership. Even when people are not the 'leaders' in a team, leadership skills such as goal setting, time management, communication, conflict resolution, and change management all support a productive and effective team. A barrier that younger people may face is that leadership training can be expensive or only available to those who are already in middle- to senior-level positions in the workforce. This project aimed to provide high-quality online leadership skills training across the ESAA global network to enhance people's leadership skills, confidence, career progression, and ability to take on leadership roles within their ESAA communities. The project also directly supports ESAA's clusters by providing skills training and allowing members from across six ESAA networks to connect. A curriculum of 12 weeks of remote, interactive leadership training was developed with a third-party training provider, The Self Leadership Initiative. This included 24 hours of training content and individual coaching sessions to assist participants in tailoring the learning to their specific

context. We created a program brochure and advertised it across the ESAA networks: ESN, OCEANS, garagERASMUS, EMA, WBAA, and ASAF. We received 104 applications for the program; 69 people were offered places, and 61 of these completed the program. The participants were split into two cohorts. The training sessions took place between May 1 and July 20, 2023, and participants had until August 12 to utilize their 1:1 coaching session. As part of the program, we also hosted interviews with two established leaders. Jean Lambert shared her wisdom from her 20-year career in the European Parliament. Bodil Agasøster gave insights from working in industry and education. Both of these interviews were recorded and posted the **OCEANS** YouTube channel on https://www.youtube.com/@TheOceansNetwork.

To evaluate the impact of the project, all participants were asked to complete a selfassessment of their leadership skills before and after the training. The smallest improvement was an 8.85% increase in 'collaborating to reach common goals. The largest improvement was a 36.65% increase in the ability to 'manage stress'. The average improvement across all 16 skill areas was 20.24%, which most definitely fulfils the objective of the project, which is to build participants' capacities.

Thank you to Erasmus+ Student and Alumni Alliance (ESAA) for supporting the initiative and all partner organizations for promoting the program. A special thanks to **Scott Darby** from OCEANS Network for his support throughout the project & **Mrs. Gemma Perkins** at The Self Leadership Initiative for delivering the training and coaching, and finally to all the participants for being engaged and sharing this wonderful learning experience.

Community Leader Global Dialogue took place in Tokyo, Japan from 2nd to 3rd August 2023 on the topic of Society 5.0. The event gathered 14 promising young leaders from different backgrounds and nationalities. This event was organised by OCEANS Network in partnership with the Erasmus Mundus Association (EMA) and Erasmus Student Network (ESN), supported by ESAA and funded by the European Union.

The New Era of Society 5.0 has begun and we live in an era of rapid technological advancement in which science and technology play a significant role in solving various challenges and social problems by utilising various innovations. This is why the role of our young generation in facing the era of Society 5.0 will be important.

Community Leader Global Dialogue was a two-day in-person event on 2nd- 3rd August 2023 in Tokyo, Japan. During two days of insightful dialogue, fourteen promising young leaders

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from different backgrounds and nationalities discussed the current issues related to Society 5.0 and contributed to the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by addressing social challenges and giving solutions to tackle the issue.

This dialogue's agenda boasted an impressive speaker lineup from both the university side and the company side. The 1st session led by **Nari Matshushima**, a lecturer at Waseda University, was on the topic of Education and Society, and there were also interactive discussions about international student perspectives related to the problems that foreigners face in Japan and how they relate to education and work. The 2nd session led by **Taiga Ogusu**, Project Manager at the International Edutainment Association, was on the topic of critical thinking and problemsolving. During the session, there were also group discussions and presentations related to sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) where the participants shared ideas and solutions for the SDGs issue.

In addition to these inspirational speaker sessions, we are thankful for the enthusiasm and spirit of the participants. As diverse thinking comes from diverse thinkers, and diverse thinkers lead to innovative solutions, we hope that the knowledge and connections shared during this event will have a positive impact on a better world.

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Project 3: Educational Serial Book Number



The ESAA project ID2021048 consortium, led by **Rahmat Putra Yudha**, developed the ESBN (Educational Serial Book Number) product to provide a unique identification number for educational books. The ESBN is a global standard for identifying educational books of all types, including textbooks, modules, workbooks, monographs, enrichment books, guidebooks, tutorials, and more. With the ESBN, each book is assigned a unique identifier consisting of a 3-digit country code, an 8-digit unique book number, a 2-digit publication year, and a 1-digit code indicating the type of educational book. This standardized system ensures that every educational book in the world can be easily identified and tracked, regardless of its publisher, author, or language.

In addition to providing a unique identification number for each book, the ESBN also uses a GTIN GS1 standard, which can be scanned to quickly and easily identify the type of educational book. The code contains information such as the book's author, title, publisher, and subject matter, allowing it to be quickly recognized and accessed by educators, researchers, and students.

The ESBN is now accessible to authors from all worldwide publishers through the website <u>www.esbn-international.com</u>. This website facilitates requests for ESBNs, making it easy for authors and publishers to obtain a unique identification number and QR code for their educational books. By making the ESBN accessible to authors and publishers worldwide, the ESAA project ID2021048 consortium is contributing to the organization and dissemination of educational resources on a global scale.

The ESBN is a valuable tool for improving the accessibility and organization of educational resources worldwide, and the ease of use and standardization it provides will help to facilitate greater collaboration and exchange of knowledge within the global educational community. Despite the challenges faced by the ESAA project ID2021048 consortium, their creation of the ESBN demonstrates their resilience and creativity in finding solutions to problems and their commitment to making high-quality educational resources available to all.

Project 4: United for Employability

Held in the Region of Casablanca, Morocco, from 8 to 10 July 2023, the project "United for employability", led by the OCEANS network in partnership with United Morocco and supported by ESAA aimed to empower youth through basketball and soft skills development. Trained by renowned experts, 17 participants developed their skills through a three-day program



17 participants, from 4 countries, and 6 nationalities, united for a common goal: aiming to enhance youth employability and develop essential soft skills through a 3-day training program,

the project "United for Employability" took place in the Region of Casablanca, Morocco, from 8 to 10 July 2023. It targeted diverse participants, both local and international, offering workshops, group discussions, basketball games, and officiating lessons. By promoting social inclusion and equal access to education, this project contributes to addressing youth unemployment and fostering a more cohesive society. Indeed, by utilising basketball as a means of engagement, the program promotes social inclusion and fosters teamwork, communication, leadership, and entrepreneurship skills.

Organised by OCEANS Network, in partnership with United Maroc, the program was led by renowned experts who provided essential skills to participants through theoretical and practical activities. Fuelled by their wish to bring an intersectional approach to education, engagement, and development, they focused on the transferability of skills between sports, and personal and professional life.

Following workshops including a reflection on the performance objectives versus result objectives as well as a presentation of international mobility opportunities, participants were able to practice through relevant and targeted activities on the court. By exercising mutual trust, playing in teams or individually, and cooperating, all these activities provided us with great examples of how sports are an essential tool for empowerment and skills development while promoting values, friendship, mutual understanding and cohesion. Learning, then sharing, playing and engaging with children to create a cohesive and safe environment, was one of the great highlights of the 3 days program. Indeed, this project is implemented in the eco-city of Zenata, in the region of Casablanca, Morocco, engaging with local people particularly children was essential. We thank the Erasmus+ Student and Alumni Alliance (ESAA) for its support in implementing the initiative.

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FOCUS ON LEADING FIGURES IN THE ACADEMIC WORLD

Professor Ameenah Gurib-Fakim served as the first female President of Mauritius from 2015 to 2018, thus making her the third woman to serve as Head of State of the country. Born in 1959, Gurib finished her higher school education at Loreto Convent Quatro Bornes before studying chemistry at the University of Surrey. She completed her PhD in organic chemistry at Exeter University before returning to Mauritius in 1987. In Mauritius, Professor Gurib-Fakim taught organic chemistry at the University of Mauritius, where she also served as Dean of the Faculty of Science and Pro-Vice Chancellor. In 2009, Gurib-Fakim opened a research centre devoted to studying the medical and nutritious effects of plant life in Mauritius, where she is still Managing Director. She served as the Chairperson for the International Council for Scientific Union – Regional Office for Africa from 2011 to 2014. In 2016, she was in the Forbes List for the 100 "Most Powerful Women in the World" and 1st among the Top 100 Women in Africa Forbes List 2017, 2019. In 2019, Gurib-Fakim also served as a keynote speaker at Cambridge University's conference "Africa Together: Which Way Forward?" For her efforts as a scientist, Gurib-Fakim has been recognized worldwide, receiving the L'Oréal-UNESCO Award for Women in Science, Laureate for the National and Economic Council, and the African Union Award for Women in Science. In 2019, Professor Ameenah Gurib-Fakim received the "Trailblazing Award for Political Leadership" from the World Women Leaders Council in Iceland. In 2022, she served on the Science Advisory Committee of the Food and Agriculture Organisation, Rome.

Professor Éléonore Yayi Ladekan is a Chemist, Full Professor, Academic and Politician from the Republic of Benin, who was twice a Minister under the presidency of His Excellency Thomas Yayi Boni and that of His Excellency Patrice Talon. In 2015, she was named one of the "50 women who have become role models in science". In 1998, she defended her PhD thesis in organic chemistry at the University of Clermont-Ferrand, France. She was 3rd Vice-Rector in charge of International Cooperation, Partnerships and Professional Integration until 2019, when she left this position to accept a new ministerial portfolio, this time in His Excellency President Patrice Talon's government as Minister for Higher Education and Scientific Research.

Professor Marirena Grigoriou is the Vice Rector of Academic Affairs, Student Affairs & Life Long Education at Democritus University of Thrace (DUTH), Alexandrouplis in Greece. She serves as a Professor at the Department of Molecular Biology & Genetics (MBG) and the Director of the Laboratory of Molecular Developmental Biology & Molecular Neurobiology. She studied Biology at the National Kapodistrian University of Athens and completed her PhD at the Institute of Molecular Biology & Biotechnology (University of Crete, 1993). She was a postdoctoral fellow at the Department of Medicine, University of Crete (1993-1995) and at the National Institute for Medical Research, London (currently Crick Institute, 1995-2000) with a Marie Curie fellowship grant from the European Union. Her research interests focus on functional networks in cellular/animal models and on the development of methods and applications of Molecular Biology. She has published more than 30 research articles in peerreviewed journals (Nature, J Neuroscience, Development etc., citations >3500). Her work at MBG-DUTH has been supported by 9 research grants (FP7-REGPOT-2008-1, INTERREG IIIA, Bilateral S&T cooperation etc.) with a total appx 2,8M€ (coordinator in 3 of them).


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

It was a chance for members to reconnect with fellow EMA members and EMA MB members, forge new connections, and celebrate the vibrant meetup community. It was an opportunity where they dived into insightful discussions, savoured local culture, and relished in the camaraderie of like-minded individuals.

On the 29th of May, ESN launched the new edition of its flagship research project, the XV ESN survey. The data collection was open until the 31st of July, and it targeted students who have participated in exchange programmes or mobilities abroad during the last two years, as well as students who have not taken part in mobility yet.

The XV ESN survey collected 17,855 answers from exchange students, 1,856 answers from full-degree students and 3,064 from non-mobile students. The success of this data collection effort can be attributed to the support and collaboration of numerous stakeholders such as the European Commission, the European Parliament, National Agencies, Higher Education Institutions, Networks of Universities and European Alliances.

In light of the ongoing midterm evaluation process of the Erasmus+ programme, ESN has launched a preliminary report with the first key findings addressing the student voices' perspective on international mobility.

During this preliminary report, valuable insights into the primary trends among students who participated in mobility between 2021 and 2023 were gained. It's important to highlight the positive impact of the implementation of the Erasmus+ 2021-2027 priorities, especially the inclusion of one, with 36% of respondents agreeing, and 46% strongly agreeing with these measures.

Findings related to exchange students highlight the need for accessibility of information, with 82% of the respondents reporting as a priority the need for information about available financial support. The challenges faced by students often revolve around insufficient money to cover the cost of living (35,63%), difficulty finding affordable housing (35,5%), and course-matching problems during their exchange period (33,97%).

Grants, while being distributed to more students before departure, student purchasing power is affected by the fundamental issues of insufficient funding and the high cost of housing during mobility. Additionally, there's room for improvement in terms of environmental sustainability and digitalisation in the exchange student experience, particularly concerning travel choices (many students still use planes) and access to online processes.

Credit recognition continues to be a concern, where 42% of students reported changes to their courses during their exchange. Lastly, while students generally express satisfaction with the services provided by Higher Education Institutions, it's worth noting that compared to the previous survey, there has been an increase in dissatisfaction rates, both with sending and hosting institutions.

On the knowledge of non-mobile students on Erasmus+ initiatives among students, it's evident that Erasmus+ for studies stands out with 95%. However, initiatives like the Blended Intensive Programme (9%) tend to be less familiar among higher education students, indicating a need for increased awareness about these opportunities.

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
